ELECTIONS TIMETABLE

This is the Union Councillor Elections Timetable for 2011.

Please remember that these dates are liable to change and you will be informed via email if these change for any reason:

DATE	EVENT
14 th October 2011 (10:00)	Nominations Open Students are able to submit a nomination at www.lufbra.net/elections
23 rd October 2011 (17:00)	Nominations Close Students are no longer able to register themselves as a candidate in the Union Councillor Elections 2011.
24 th October 2011 (10:00)	Campaigning Starts Please note that campaigning can only begin after the Returning Officer or Acting Returning Officer has declared campaigning can start. This will be done through emailing students who have nominated themselves and are eligible to run. Candidates may face disciplinary action if they campaign before this.
31 st October 2011 (09:00)	Voting Opens Students may now vote for candidates on the Students Union website at www.lufbra.net/elections
2 nd November 2011 (13:00)	Voting Closes Students may no longer vote for candidates in the Union Councillor Elections 2011.
2 nd November 2011 (20:00)	Results Announced Results will be announced in Fusion in conjunction with department committee election results. Some results may not be disclosed at the discretion of the Returning Officer or Acting Returning Officer.
6 th November 2011 (13:00)	Union Council Training All new Councillors will be expected to attend Union Council Training in council chambers.
16 th November 2011	Union Council All new Councillors will be expected to attend Union Council in Room One. Dress is informal and should last no longer than two hours.

INSTRUCTIONS & RULES

This contains rules to the election regulations as laid down in the Union Standing Orders found in the constitution.

1.1 All nominations must be online.

1.2 All nominees must have a Proposer and a Secunder all of whom must be student members of Loughborough Students' Union with valid Union Cards.

1.3 Your Proposer or Secunder may not propose or second any other candidate for the same position and may only propose one candidate and second one candidate.

1.4 Current Officers of the Union may not propose or second the nomination of any candidate.

1.5 Candidates may not propose or second a nomination for a position that they themselves are also nominated for.

1.6 The Procedures Committee will meet to ratify the nominations on 2nd November 2011.

1.7 The voting times and dates are shown on the election timetable, the voting will be carried out using the union's online voting system.

1.8 The count will be carried out electronically using the online voting system.

1.9 The PCs in the main Union Office may be used for election material after 5pm. Other computers in departmental offices may not be used without the permission of the Returning Officer or Acting Returning Officer. Use of equipment will depend on availability, but no booking system will operate. No office equipment is to be used during office hours 9am-5pm.

1.10 Candidates are reminded that they or their assistants may not campaign while engaged in duties for the Union. Any officer or staff member breaking this rule will be subject to disciplinary action and will also render the candidate concerned liable for disqualification.

HOW TO NOMINATE

This document contains further instructions how to nominate yourself in the Union Councillor Elections 2011:

1. Login to the website - www.lufbra.net (Please ensure you have registered)
2. Go to contact details- ensure you have a current e-mail and telephone number (We will use these as your direct contact details)
3. Go to www.lufbra.net/elections
4. Select '*stand in election*'
5. Enter your preferred name and select save
6. Click continue in the green box at the top of the page
7. '*Select stand*'
8. Enter ID Numbers of Proposer and select find person.
9. Repeat this for your Seconder (please select '*find person*' and not the enter key.)
10. Select '*submit proposers*'
11. From menu upload manifesto and enter text and a jpeg photo of yourself **only**.
12. Select save
13. You may now preview your manifesto
14. You have now completed the process; your nomination will be reviewed by elections committee. You will then be notified if you are accepted as valid candidate
15. You have the option to withdraw from this election by going to review '*nominations*' menu.

CAMPAIGNING & VOTING

This document contains further instructions regarding campaign and voting in the Union Councillor Elections 2011.

1. Each candidate should ensure that they understand and abide by all the Election Regulations included in Standing Order F, Standing Order G and all instructions in this Candidates Pack.
2. No candidate is permitted to start their election campaign before the Returning Officer has opened the election which will take place on the 1st of November.
3. Electoral regulations prohibit any candidates or their supporters from removing publicity material displayed by another candidate.
4. Voting shall be by the alternative and single transferable vote system. This means that the electorate may vote for candidates in order of preference by numbering their ballot paper 1,2,3,4 etc.
5. Voting will be accessible through the Union Website at www.lufbra.net/elections
6. Any candidate wishing to withdraw their nomination must do so by the 5th November.
7. In order that the candidates do not receive advantage or disadvantage from their position on the ballot paper the Acting Returning Officer shall ensure:
 - Each candidate's name appears first on an equal number of ballot papers.

MANIFESTOS

All candidates will be required to submit a photo of themselves and a 150 word manifesto online with their nomination. This will be displayed on the Union Website whilst students will be able to register their votes.

VOTING

Please note that **only students from your department** will be able to vote for you in the Union Councillor Elections. It is recommended to campaign within your department to avoid confusion between candidates and disappointment on the voting days.

UNION COUNCILLORS

RESPONSIBILITY

- a) The running union councillor elections shall be the responsibility of the elections committee.
- b) The Chair of Council shall act as returning officer for the duration of these elections, should they be unavailable, council shall elect a returning officer from within its membership.

TIMING

- a) The Primary Elections shall not start in the first six weeks of term, and shall be concluded before the end of the first term.
- b) Vacancies caused by graduating councillors may be filled by a Secondary Election to take place in may to fill any vacancies that may arise.
- c) Vacancies resulting from any cause other than that mentioned in the above point shall be filled using the standard casual vacancy procedure outlined in Schedule V.
- d) The date of the election, along with all necessary details shall be made available no less than one month before the nominations are to open.
- e) The period for candidate nominations must be no less than one week.

ELIGIBILITY

- a) Any Full member of the union, excluding the executive committee and chair of council shall be entitled to enter as a candidate of union councillor.
- b) The number of available councillor positions shall be determined by department at the beginning of the academic year using the criteria outlined in Paragraph 8 section c.ii.a of the union constitution.

CANDIDATES PACK

- a) Elections Committee shall fix the dates, times of the day of voting, the hustings and the copy date of the publishing of manifestos and these shall be minuted for ratification by a meeting of Council not less than fourteen days before nominations open.

VOTING

- a) Union Councillor Elections are to be conducted using the online voting mechanism on the Loughborough Students Union website.
- b) The voting shall use the Alternate Transferable Voting system as described in Standing order C Section 2, and shall be run in accordance with standing order G.
- c) Voting shall be setup so as to allow only members of a given department to vote for candidates from that department.

UNION COUNCILLOR ELECTIONS 2011

- b) This meeting shall be widely publicised and open to all members of the union.
